Regulation 22 Consultation Statement Part 2- Regulation 19 Submission Local Plan

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1. Introduction

Purpose

- 1.1 This consultation statement sets out how the Council has undertaken communication, participation and stakeholder involvement on the Local Plan Regulation 19 Submission, setting out details of consultation events and engagement required by Regulation 20 of Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012.
- 1.2 It is important to note that this document is Part 2 of the Regulation 22 Consultation Statement, and that Part 1 details the full process undertaken during earlier preparation of the Local Plan under Regulation 18 stages.
- 1.3 This Regulation 22 consultation statement has been produced to respond to and therefore fulfil requirements set out in the Regulations, specifically Regulation 22(1) part (c), set out below.

(i) which bodies and persons the local planning authority invited to make representations under Regulation 18;

(ii) how those bodies and persons were invited to make representations under Regulation 18;

(iii) a summary of the main issues raised by the representations made pursuant to Regulation 18;

(iv) how any representations made pursuant to Regulation 18 have been taken into account;

(v) if representations were made pursuant to Regulation 20, the number of representations made and a summary of the main issues raised in those representations; and

(vi) if no representations were made in Regulation 20, that no such representations were made.

- 1.4 In accordance with the Regulations set out above, this document sets out the details of representations made pursuant to Regulation 20, and a summary of the main issues raised in those representations (Appendix F).
- 1.5 Aside from demonstrating compliance with the Regulations above, this statement also highlights how the Council has met the requirements its adopted <u>Statement of Community Involvement</u> (SCI) 2019. The SCI document sets out how the Council will consult and involve the public and statutory consultees in all planning matters.



Background

- 1.6 The creation of a new Local Plan requires a number of thorough and robust stages of consultation. This is to enable early and ongoing engagement with the local community, businesses and organisations to develop a comprehensive document, tailored to the needs of the District in terms of strategy and the policies required.
- 1.7 The updated timetable for the Dover District Local Plan production, as set out in September 2022 Local Development Scheme (LDS) identifies that:
- Consultation on the Regulation 18 draft local plan was completed in 2021
- The Regulation 19 Consultation on the Dover District Local Plan Submission Document was to take place in Quarter 4 of 2022 for a 7-week period
- Submission of the Local Plan to the Planning Inspectorate programmed for quarters 1-2 of 2023
- Examination in Public of the Local Plan programmed for quarters 3-4 of 2023
- Adoption of the Local Plan is programmed for 2024.
- 1.8 The Part 1 Regulation 22 Statement sets out in more detail the background to the production of the Local Plan, the purpose and aims of the Local Plan and the development plan documents it will replace. It also sets out all the consultation and engagement which took place prior to the Regulation 19 Submission document consultation.
- 1.9 This Part 2 Regulation 22 statement provides full details of the engagement undertaken by DDC with specific and statutory bodies, general consultee groups, residents, businesses and all other interested parties during the 7-week consultation period from **9am October 21st to 5pm on December 9th 2022,** on the Regulation 19 Submission Local Plan to 2040, and supporting documents.

2. Who was invited to participate at Regulation 19?

Formal Notifications and Correspondence

- 2.1 Statutory/Specific Consultees were contacted by both email and letter on the 21st October 2022 inviting them to view and respond to the Local Plan Regulation 19 Submission and the three supporting documents open for consultation during the same time period. This correspondence included a link to the Statement of Representations procedure and can be seen in Appendix B: Letters and Correspondence.
- 2.2 All General and Specific Consultees listed in Appendix A: List of Specific and General Consultees as well as consultees registered on the Objective database were contacted via email on the 21st of October and by letter where email was not available. This correspondence can be seen in Appendix B.
- 2.3 The Council also contacted all consultees that made comments at Regulation 18 stages of Plan preparation and all persons that had been registered to the DDC Online consultation portal (Objective) to invite them to participate in the consultations. A copy of this notification can also be found in **Appendix B**.



Town and Parish Councils

- 2.4 The Council contacted the Town and Parish Councils separately to the other specific consultation bodies via post prior to the commencement of the consultation period to notify them of the proposed start date and provide copies of the consultation documents so they were able to share information with interested residents and businesses in their areas. This included:
 - Local Plan Regulation 19 Submission Document
 - Hard copy representation forms for the Local Plan*
 - Hard copy representation forms for the Evidence Base (Sustainability Appraisal, Habitats Regulation Assessment and Infrastructure Development Plan)*
 - Statement of Representations Procedure*
 - Summary of changes to Site Allocations
 - List of supporting Documents*
 - Local Plan Posters*
- 2.5 It was requested within the covering letter that the Town and Parish Councils advertise the Local Plan consultation by putting up the posters included within the pack around their Parish/Town area, as well as publicising it on their own websites and social media accounts.
- 2.6 Details of promotion of the consultation made by the Town and Parish Councils can be found in **Appendix D: Promotion, Advertisement and Evidence from Consultation.**
- 2.7 The cover letter also included information about the planned exhibition events, details of how to make representations and how to contact the Local Plans team should assistance be required.

Keep me Posted Alerts

2.8 'Keep me posted' is the Councils overall notification system that any interested party can sign up to from the main DDC website and specify their interests. All persons subscribed to topics related to planning / Local Plan were directly notified when the Local Plan consultation commenced via this email system.

3. Engagement and Advertising

3.1 The 2012 Regulations (Regulation 19) require the following with regards to advertising the Regulation 19 Submission documents consultation and making documents available:

Before submitting a local plan to the Secretary of State under section 20 of the Act, the local planning authority must:

(a) make a copy of each of the proposed submission documents and a statement of the representations procedure available in accordance with regulation 35, and

(b) ensure that a statement of the representations procedure and a statement of the fact that the proposed submission documents are available for inspection and of the places and times at which they can be inspected, is sent to each of the general consultation bodies and each of the specific consultation bodies invited to make representations under regulation 18(1).

3.2 This chapter sets out how these requirements and additional engagement was undertaken during the consultation period.

Exhibitions and Events:

In Person Exhibitions

3.8 The Council hosted five in person exhibitions across the district in the following locations:

- Aylesham Welfare Leisure Centre, Spinney Lane Tuesday 1st November 3-7pm
- Deal Dover Youth Hub, Park Avenue Friday 4th November 3-7pm
- Sandwich The Gallery, Sandwich Guildhall Wednesday 9th November 3-7pm
- Dover St Mary's Parish Centre Wednesday 16th November 1-5pm
- Eythorne and Elvington Elvington Community Centre 24th November 4-6pm
- 3.9 The events were focused in the settlements in the district with strategic site allocations in the Local Plan. They were programmed at times / dates where it was envisaged a wide range of interested parties and residents would be able to attend, in accessible and central locations.



- 3.10 The Eythorne and Elvington event was included after the initial programme of events was published, at the request of the Parish Council. It is therefore not on the original Local Plan posters. DDC did create an additional poster for the PC to distribute regarding this specific event, which can be found in **Appendix D: Promotion, Advertisement and Evidence from Consultation.**
- 3.11 The Exhibitions provided the opportunity all interested parties to come and speak with members of the Dover District Council Local Plans Team as well as read the Exhibition Boards (In **Appendix D: Promotion, Advertisement and Evidence from Consultation**.
- 3.12 Demonstrations of how to make representations on the online portal were made available on request at the events, as well as hard copy representation forms, guidance notes and summary leaflets for attendees to take away with them.

Virtual Staffed Events

- 3.13 The Council hosted two online "Virtual" events via Microsoft Teams on Tuesday 8th November 12-2pm and Tuesday 22nd November 6-8pm.
- 3.14 Between 20 and 40 attendees participated in one of the events¹. A recording of one of the virtual events can be found here: <u>Virtual Event (YouTube)</u>
- 3.15 Following the virtual presentation of the Local Plan by officers, attendees were able to anonymously participate in a question-and-answer session which were answered 'live' by DDC staff. Questions that led to responses that were considered may be helpful to other consultees were added to an updated FAQs document on the Local Plan Website, along with the recording of the virtual event for others to watch.

Dedicated Phone Line and Email Address

- 3.16 A dedicated Local Plan phone number was available for the duration of the consultation period and advertised in communications with consultees. It was open Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays 2pm 4pm. A dedicated email address was also created and both were monitored by Local Plan team members.
- 3.17 Consultees were able to use these services for the following:
 - Hardcopy documents were sent out upon request, this included copied of the Plan and evidence base, representation forms and guidance notes/FAQs
 - Accessible documents, or those in a different format/language were able to be requested if required
 - Verbal and written assistance with understanding the Local Plan consultation, locating information on the website and online portal, and completing the representation forms

¹ Due to the nature of these anonymous 'drop in' virtual sessions, the total numbers of attendees is unknown. The attendee count is based on the highest number of participants at a single time point.



Guidance Notes and FAQs

- 3.18 The Council prepared a number of documents to assist interested parties in understanding the Local Plan document, process and regulations and to assist them in making representations. This included specific guidance on how to complete representation forms, guidance on the soundness tests, and general FAQs on the Local Plan and Developer Obligations and Infrastructure Delivery Plan.
- 3.19 There were also summary leaflets prepared and other documents on changes to the Local Plan between Regulation 18 and 19 stages. These were available in the deposit boxes, were sent to Town and Parish Councils, available to view and download on the website and printed copies were available to take away from the in person exhibitions.
- 3.20 These documents can all be viewed in Appendix C: Local Plan Informative Documents, Guidance and Webpages.

Infrastructure Delivery Plan Draft 2022

5. Summary of Representations and Main Issues

Local Plan

- 5.1 In total **1,928** comments (representations) were received from **586** respondents on the Local Plan Regulation 19 document. Of the total representations received, **8** were group/petition representations signed by a total of **1,706** representors.
- 5.2 In accordance with Regulations, details of those representations made pursuant to Regulation 20, who they were made by and on what part of the Local Plan along with a summary of the comment and Council's response can be found in Appendix F: Regulation 20 Representations Summary and Council Response

Supporting documents

- 5.3 50 representations were made on the Sustainability Appraisal of the Local Plan Submission document, from 42 consultees. 15 comments, from 15 consultees were made on the Habitats Regulation Assessment. The comments made on the SA and HRA and Council response to those can be found in Annex C of Appendix F: Representations Summary and Council Response.
- 5.4 44 comments were made on the Draft Infrastructure Delivery Plan 2022. The consultation responses will be summarised and addressed within an update to the IDP document later in 2023 and are not included within this report. However, where comments on the IDP were considered to also be relevant to the content of the Local Plan, they were copied to that consultation as a duplicate.



What is the Local Plan?			
What is being consulted upon?	In early 2020 we consulted on the Regulation 18 version of the Dover Local Plan and we have carefully considered these responses in producing a Regulation 19 version of Local Plan. The Council considers that the Local Plan together with the supporting evidence base is now ready to go forward for independent examination by the Government Planning Inspectorate. Before submitting, we are inviting representations on the Regulation 19 Submission Version of the Local Plan and the supporting evidence base. A consultation will run for 7 weeks from 21 st October 2022 and comments		
	must be received before 5 pm on the 9th December 2022 .		
What does Regulation 19 mean?	Regulation 19 is a requirement in the Town and Country Planning (Local planning) (England) Regulations 2012. The Regulations state that before submitting a Local Plan to the Government's Planning Inspectorate for independent examination, the council must publish a draft of the local plan and formally invite comments (known as representations) on it. The Regulations make clear that the Council must inform and invite representations from both statutory bodies like the Environment Agency, Natural England and Historic England and from residents and businesses in the area of the Local Plan.		
What can I comment on?	 The Regulation 19 consultation presents the opportunity to comment on the content of the local plan, within three specific remits, that include: Legal Compliance – does the Local Plan meet the legal requirements? Soundness – has the Local Plan been positively prepared, justified, effective, and consistent with national policy? Meets the Duty to Cooperate – has the Council in preparing the Local Plan engaged and worked effectively with neighbouring authorities and statutory bodies? 		
What is legal compliance?	In order to be legally compliant, the Local Plan must:		

What is soundness?	 Be prepared in accordance with the Council's Local Development Scheme and its Statement of Community Involvement Be subject to a Sustainability Appraisal and a Habitat Regulations Assessment Include policies designed to secure that the development and use of land in the local planning authority's area contribute to the mitigation of, and adaptation to, climate change Be prepared in accordance with the Equality Act 2010 Comply with all other relevant legal requirements including: Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, the Town and Country Planning (Local planning) (England) Regulations 2012, the Localism Act 2011 and the Neighbourhood Planning Act 2017. Paragraph 35 of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) 2021 sets out that Local Plans are 'sound' if they are:
	 a) Positively prepared - providing a strategy which, as a minimum, seeks to meet the area's objectively assessed needs and is informed by agreements with other authorities, so that unmet need from neighbouring areas is accommodated where it is practical to do so and is consistent with achieving sustainable development; b) Justified - an appropriate strategy, taking into account the reasonable alternatives, and based on proportionate evidence; c) Effective - deliverable over the Plan period, and based on effective joint working on crossboundary strategic matters that have been dealt with rather than deferred, as evidenced by the statement of common ground; d) Consistent with national policy - enabling the delivery of sustainable development in accordance with the policies in this Framework and other statements of national planning policy, where relevant.
What is meeting the Duty to Cooperate?	The requirements of the Duty to Cooperate are set out in Section 110 of the Localism Act 2011 and Section 33A of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. The legislation requires all Local planning authorities to demonstrate that they have had active and on-going cooperation with key bodies, such as neighbouring authorities and other statutory bodies on strategic matters, including infrastructure, housing and employment needs and flooding. Comments relating to the duty to cooperate must be specific in terms of how and why they believe the plan has, or has not met its duty, and support this with evidence and justification.
Are comments made at Regulation 18 still relevant?	The Council has revised the Local Plan since the Regulation 18 consultation due to changes in National Policy and in response to representations received. As a result, the Regulation 18 comments may no longer be relevant to the Policies in the Regulation 19 Submission Version Local Plan. Further, the Planning Inspector examining the Local Plan is only sent responses made to the Regulation 19 Draft Local Plan. Responding to the Regulation 19 plan also includes the right to request to present evidence orally at one or more of the hearing sessions that the Planning Inspector will arrange as part of the examination process.

After the period of publication, carried out in accordance with Regulation 19, the Council will collate all the representations received and submit them to the Secretary of State together with the Local Plan Submission Draft Document, supporting documents and evidence. The Secretary of State will then appoint an independent Planning Inspector to examine the Local Plan. The examination is a process that includes a series of hearing sessions that discuss matters relevant to the Plan.
Respondents wishing to take part in the hearing (oral) session(s) must outline why they think it's necessary in their representations. The Inspector will decide the most appropriate procedure to hear from respondents who would like to participate in hearing(s). This may be in writing, or respondents may be invited to attend and speak at the hearing sessions. Respondents can always change their mind later but without indicating a wish at Regulation 19 there is no way for the Inspector, or their Programme Officer, to know to contact them.
The Examination will assess whether the plan has been prepared in accordance with legal and procedural requirements and if it is 'sound'. The Inspector will consider the evidence provided by the Council to support the plan and any representations which have been put forward by local people and other interested parties. In most cases the Examination will include hearing sessions which are held in public.
At the end of the Examination the Inspector will send a report to the Council recommending whether or not they can adopt the plan. In most cases the report will recommend some changes that are necessary to allow the plan to be adopted. These are known as 'main modifications'. Will you be advising the public what you have changed to the Local Plan based on responses received to the consultation, and when and how will you do this?	Following the close of the consultation, the Council will review and collate all the representations received and submit them to the Secretary of State together with the Local Plan Submission Document, supporting documents and evidence. The Secretary of State will then appoint an independent Planning Inspector(s) to examine the Local Plan. If, following the review of the responses received to this consultation, the Council considers major changes are needed to plan to address issues raised prior to it being submitted to the Secretary of State for examination, a further Regulation 19 consultation would need to take place on those changes only. During the examination, the Inspector will consider whether any changes are needed to the Plan to address all comments received. A bold vision for 2040

Why are we producing a new Local Plan?

The Government requires that all local authorities have an up-to-date Local Plan in place by December 2023. Dover District's existing Local Plan consists of the Core Strategy 2010 and the Land Allocations Plan 2015, as well as saved policies from the 2002 Local Plan. Since these plans were written, the Government has made changes to legislation, policy and guidance which means they now need to be reviewed and updated.

What is the Local Plan?

This Plan establishes the vision, strategic objectives and overarching development strategy required to meet the needs of the district to 2040.

It sets out the strategic planning policies of the Council on the important issues facing the District including responding to climate change, accommodating population trends, enabling economic growth, improving provision of community facilities and infrastructure across the district and the need to protect and enhance our natural and historic environments.

It establishes a broad range of clear development management policies to shape decisions on all planning applications that come forward in the District. It clarifies in detail where new homes, A25 anterbu ANDWICH workplaces and infrastructure A257 facilities will be located across the B2046 District through allocations of land. Where is the new development proposed?

An important element of a Local Plan is ensuring sufficient land is allocated for housing, employment and other development to meet the needs of the District, based upon the evidence.

Three strategic housing allocations are proposed in the Plan, at:

- Whitfield (6,350 homes);
- South Aylesham (640 homes) and
- Elvington/Eythorne (300 homes)

New housing is also proposed at other smaller settlements across the District, based primarily on the settlement hierarchy and influenced by site availability, the need to protect the most environmentally sensitive areas of the District and deliverability matters.

To grow and diversify the local economy, four sites are proposed for employment uses - the White Cliffs Business Park, Whitfield, Discovery Park, Sandwich, Aylesham Development Area and Statenborough Farm in Eastry.

Four other sites are also identified in the Plan for a mixture of employment and other uses to support their regeneration - the former Snowdown Colliery in Aylesham, Western Heights, Fort Burgoyne and Dover Waterfront.

New plans to reinvigorate Dover Town Centre are set out in the Dover Town Centre Strategy which is one of the central objectives of this new Local Plan.

Dover Town Centre Strategy Plan



Main changes since the Regulation 18 draft Local Plan

Consultation on the draft Local Plan (known as the Regulation 18 Consultation) took place in early 2021. Over 3,400 responses were received. A number of changes have been made to the Plan as a result of these comments, as well as changes to national legislation and guidance that have occurred. The majority of these are minor changes and updates, however, there have been a number of more significant changes including:

- Overall, the Local Plan Housing Need has been reduced by more than 900 dwellings.
- A number of housing site allocations have been removed from the Plan, including 500 homes at North Aylesham, 100 homes at the former Channel Tunnel workers accommodation, Farthingloe and 100 homes in Westcourt Lane, Shepherdswell
- 17 new housing sites have been added that can accommodate approximately 360 dwellings.
- Economic development needs assessment updated and two new employment site allocations added, at White Cliffs Business Park (Phase 4) and Statenborough Farm in Eastry.
- Four sites have been identified for a mixture of employment to support their regeneration: the former Snowdown Colliery in Aylesham, The Citadel Western Heights, Fort Burgoyne and Dover Waterfront.
- Gypsy and Traveller sites at Aylesham and Ewell Minnis have been removed, and a new site for intensification in Alkham is proposed.
- Wording has been changed in the policy relating to residential windfall (sites not allocated in this Plan) proposals in the Kent Downs AONB to ensure appropriate protection and additional criteria have been added to prevent significant loss of best and most versatile agricultural land and to ensure proposals do not prejudice the delivery of sites allocated in the Plan due to limited highway capacity.
- Climate change policies have been updated to reflect the changes to Building Regulations of June 2022 with regard to carbon emissions, energy efficiency and sustainable design and construction.
- Biodiversity policies have been strengthened to ensure maximum protection for protected habitats, landscapes and species.
- A new tariff has been introduced to fund necessary mitigation and monitoring of the Thanet Coast and Sandwich Bay SPA, an internationally protected site for migratory birds.
- Place making and design policies have been strengthened and commitment to delivering a District Design Code added.
- Plan updated to reflect latest transport modelling work with regards to Strategic Highways and Local Road Network improvements.
- Open Space, Sports Provision and Community facilities policies have been updated, including designation of Local Green Spaces in the district.
- Protection of River Dour has been strengthened.
- References to Stodmarsh nutrient issues removed as they no longer apply to this district.

How to Comment Guide



How to comment on the Regulation 19 Submission Local Plan

The Regulation 19 Submission Version of the Local Plan and its supporting documents are being published for public consultation for a period of 7 weeks from the **21th October 2022 to the 9th December 2022 at 5pm**.

During this time we would encourage you to read the consultation document and make comments (also known as representations).

The main consultation document, supporting evidence and settlement maps for each area of the District can be viewed at the Council's dedicated Local Plan website <u>www.doverdistrictlocalplan.co.uk</u>. This will be the main access point to all of the consultation material and the main way to submit comments.

What can I comment on?

Comments on the Local Plan, must be within three specific remits, that include:

- Legal Compliance does the Local Plan meet the legal requirements?
- **Soundness** has the Local Plan been positively prepared, justified, effective, and consistent with national policy? and,
- **Meets the Duty to Cooperate** has the Council in preparing the Local Plan engaged and worked effectively with neighbouring authorities and statutory bodies?

There is separate guidance on these matters, call Legal Compliance, Soundness and Duty to Cooperate Guidance Notes.

We are also consulting on the:

- Sustainability Appraisal of the Regulation 19 Local Plan (2022),
- Habitats Regulations Assessment of the Regulation 19 Local Plan (2022),
- Infrastructure Delivery Plan (2022)

General advice when commenting

- Responses should be made through the Council's online consultation portal (<u>https://dover-consult.objective.co.uk/kse</u>);
- If you have particular difficulties using the consultation portal we will be able to accept representation forms by email (<u>localplan@dover.gov.uk</u>) or by post to Local Plans Team, Dover District Council, Council Offices, White Cliffs Business Park, Dover CT16 3PJ
- Attachments should only be submitted where they are necessary to support the response (e.g. plans or images) responses that simply state 'see attachment' may not be accepted.

- Responses should be brief and 'to the point' and aim to answer the questions on the response form.
- At examination the Inspector will give the same weight to an issue whether it appears in hundreds of responses or only in one. Where a group (for example an action group) shares a common view on how the Local Plan or one of the supporting documents should be changed, it will assist if the group only makes a single response. In such cases the response should indicate how many people the group represents, and how the group's response has been authorised.

Sustainability Appraisal and Habitats Regulations Assessment:

The Sustainability Appraisal and Habitats Regulations Assessment are required in order for the Local Plan to be legally compliant, but their findings are also open to consultation. Responses must specifically address the conclusions made in either the Sustainability Appraisal or Habitats Regulations Assessment, and not solely be a comment on the proposals made in the Local Plan.

Infrastructure Delivery Plan

Investment in infrastructure is needed to support the proposed scale of growth in the Local Plan. The IDP identifies what infrastructure is required, when it is required, how much it will cost and who will deliver it. Infrastructure includes transport, open spaces, schools, water supply, sewage infrastructure and numerous other matters. We are interested in your comments on this detailed evidence document.

How to submit a comment on the Objective Consultation Portal

- You can view the Local Plan document without registering on Objective but you will be prompted to register for an account and give your name, email and postal address if you make a comment.
- To register for an account, click the 'Sign in' Icon, in the top right corner of the screen. From here you can choose to either 'log in' (if you already have set up an account and have a user name and password) or register. If this is your first occasion using the portal, select 'Register' and set up an account.
- You can register as a first-time user by entering your details as prompted. Alternatively, you can choose to register by using an existing social media profile on either Facebook or Twitter
- Comment boxes have been attached to specific sections of the document to enable separate comments to be made on individual sections. You will be asked to confirm your details when you answer the <u>first</u> question in each section, please check and click the next button at the bottom of the form.
- Your name, organisation and comments will be published for others to see on this portal after they have been processed -but your other personal details will not be shown. However, it may be necessary to disclose these to the Planning Inspector at a later date.
- You can save your comment as Draft. Draft comments are sign posted throughout the document as 'incomplete' so that they can be returned to. Don't forget to complete your comment(s) before the consultation ends.
- Once you are happy with your comment select 'complete comment'.

- You can then review comments using the blue 'Review' button which will appear at the top right of the screen. You can then edit any question by clicking on the pencil icon, and then save any changes by clicking on the save button or the disk icon.
- You then <u>must</u> click 'submit' at the top.
- You will receive a notification email when you submit a comment/s and when they have been validated and published. The emails are sent out by our consultation partner and will come from <u>consult@objective.co.uk</u>. If you don't receive these emails please check your junk folder as your notification email may be there.
- You are able to review all of your submitted comments across all consultations by clicking on your username at the top right of the screen.
- Please note that comments on the Sustainability Appraisal, Habitats Regulations Assessment and Infrastructure Delivery Plan are completed on a form that requires you to specify what part you are commenting on, whereas the Regulation 19 Submission document allows you to comment against the relevant part of the document.

Guidance Note on Legal compliance, Soundness and the Duty to Co-operate

Legal compliance

Once the Council submit the Local Plan to the Planning Inspectorate for Examination, a Planning Inspector will first check that the Plan meets the legal requirements of the <u>Planning</u> and <u>Compulsory Purchase Act 2004</u> (as amended by the <u>Localism Act 2011</u>) and the <u>Town</u> and <u>Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012</u>, before moving on to consider the tests of soundness. This includes public participation in the preparation of the Local Plan.

You should also consider the following before making a representation on legal compliance:

Local Development Scheme

Preparation of the Local Plan should be in accordance with the current Local Development Scheme (LDS). This is available at: Local Development Scheme Sep 22 (doverdistrictlocalplan.co.uk).

Statement of Community Involvement

The process for public engagement for the Local Plan should be in general accordance with the Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) which is available at: <u>Planning-SCI-2019-update-WEB.pdf (dover.gov.uk)</u>.

Sustainability Appraisal and Habitats Regulations Assessment

The Council is required to publish a Sustainability Appraisal report and Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) when publishing the Local Plan. This should identify the process by which the Sustainability Appraisal and HRA has been carried out, the baseline information used to inform the process, and the outcomes of that process.

National Planning Policy

Justified

An appropriate strategy, taking into account the reasonable alternatives, and based on proportionate evidence;

Effective

Deliverable over the plan period, and based on effective joint working on cross-boundary strategic matters that have been dealt with rather than deferred, as evidenced by the statement of common ground; and

Consistent with national policy

Enabling the delivery of sustainable development in accordance with the policies in this Framework and other statements of national planning policy, where relevant.

Compliance with the Duty to Co-operate

The Local Plan should comply with the Duty to Cooperate.

Section 33A of the Planning & Compulsory Purchase Act requires the Council to engage constructively, actively, and on an ongoing basis with neighbouring authorities and certain other bodies over strategic matters during the preparation of the Plan.

The Council is expected to provide evidence of how they have complied with the Duty. Noncompliance with the Duty to Cooperate cannot be rectified after the submission of the Plan. Therefore, the Inspector has no power to recommend modifications in this regard.

Where the Duty has not been complied with, the Inspector cannot recommend adoption of the Plan.

Planning Obligations (S106) and Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) FAQs

What are Planning Obligations / Section 106 Agreements?

Planning obligations are legal obligations entered into as part of a planning application to mitigate the impacts of a development proposal. Planning obligations are also commonly referred to as 'section 106', as well as 'developer contributions' or 'Community Infrastructure Levy' (CIL).

Section 106 agreements are legal agreements between developers and the local council linked to planning permissions, and this is the system that DDC uses to secure contributions. DDC do not operate CIL.

What do S106 Agreements do?

S106 agreements are needed when a development will have impacts on the local area that cannot be moderated by means of conditions on a planning decision. For example, a new residential development can place extra pressure on the social, physical and/or economic infrastructure which already exists in a certain area. Usually this occurs on larger schemes of 10 or more houses or sites of 0.5ha or more.

A planning obligation will aim to balance the pressure created by the new development with improvements to the surrounding area ensuring that, where possible, the development would make a positive contribution to the local area and community.

However, they must meet certain legal tests, they must be:

- necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms;
- directly related to the development; and
- fairly and reasonably related in scale and kind to the development.

Section 106 payments relate directly to the development with which they are associated, and can only be spent as specified in the S106 agreement signed by all relevant parties. In some cases, infrastructure will be delivered on-site, rather than through a financial contribution.

Please note the monies collected cannot be spent on anything else in generic terms, regardless of the need of such funding.

Examples of infrastructure:

- Affordable Housing
- Strategic Highway and local road improvements, walking and cycling routes (via KCC Highways, not DDC)
- Rail Network and station improvements
- Bus networks and bus infrastructure
- Waste and Recycling Management (via KCC)
- Water supply, drainage and utilities
- Health, including GP services (via NHS)
- Green Infrastructure, Open Spaces, Play Areas and Sports and Leisure Facilities
- Education, Adult Education, Libraries and Social Care (via KCC) and community facilities
- Cultural and Public Realm improvements

Where can I see examples of Infrastructure planned or already provided through S106 Process?

The Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS) is an annual report which is published on DDCs website. The report sets out:

- A summary of all financial & non-financial developer contributions agreed
- Amount of developer contributions held and spent by the authority
- Details of infrastructure the authority is intending to either wholly or part fund through S106 funds
- Report on estimated future S106 income from developer contributions
 Search 'IFS' on DDC website to locate a copy

How are S106 funds calculated and projects identified?

Some contributions are calculated through a set formula, for example the amount of Affordable Housing, open space, sports and play contributions are determined by a set policy in the Local Plan.

As part of the Local Plan, a number of evidence base documents and consultation was undertaken to identify projects in the district.



Planning Obligations (S106) and Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) FAQs

How is the S106 funding allocated to projects?

DDC allocate money to the various delivery teams within the Council, specialising in the various possible spending areas such as communities, open space, leisure and play or affordable housing. They then deliver the requirement through a robust, auditable procedure.

Monies are also allocated to Kent County Council for Education, Waste, and Libraries and the NHS/Clinical Commissioning Group for healthcare if the S106 agreement specifies that a payment is to be made to them. These are usually set amounts per dwelling, but on larger sites may be an on-site requirement for a new provision, for example a new school.

Transfer of S106 funds to Town and Parish Councils can occur where DDC deems it is the best use of funds received. For example, if DDC do not own open space within a set village but the Parish Council does, the funds received for an open space/play/sports contribution can be transferred.

It is important to note that not all infrastructure is funded through planning obligations. Many providers have a statutory responsibility to provide services themselves and there are also many other funding sources which can be used, such as government funds and grants.

What is the IDP and what is it used for?

An Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) sets out:

- Current Infrastructure and whether its at capacity (Based on other evidence base and communication with providers)
- Planned Infrastructure and Strategies (including current S106 agreements)
- Future Infrastructure needs
- The timing, costs and delivery partners
- Potential funding solutions

This enables DDC to determine which projects are required to have funding directed to them when S106 agreements are being created.

How are impacts on the Road Network addressed in the Local Plan and IDP?

As part of the new Local Plan preparation, all potential sites were assessed to determine their specific impacts, and potential cumulative effects, on the road network. Where it is considered that mitigation is required (in consultation with Kent Highways), this is identified within site specific policies and the Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) which supports the Local Plan.

Where the impacts of development were considered to be 'severe' and there were no deliverable options for mitigation, sites were considered unacceptable.

As part of a planning application, developers will need to submit a Transport Assessment and/or Travel Plan to detail any highway issues and sustainable transport options. This will need to address issues identified in the Local Plan policies and the IDP.

KCC Highways will review this and determine whether the traffic generated from a scheme creates an issue that requires resolution through the provision of local road and/or footpath and cycle path improvements. If off-site improvements are needed, then the developer may enter into a separate legal agreement with KCC Highways.

Where can we view and comment on the IDP?

The draft IDP is open for comments alongside the Local Plan consultation from 21st October to 9th December.

About The Local Plan

The Local Plan sets out the vision, strategic objectives and overarching development strategy for the growth of the District over the period to 2040.

It provides the planning policy framework to guide the future development of the area, addressing needs and opportunities for housing, the economy, community facilities and infrastructure, as well as the basis for conserving and enhancing the natural and historic environment, mitigating and adapting to climate change, and achieving well designed places.

Why are we producing a New Local Plan? -

The Government requires that all local authorities have an up-to-date Local Plan in place by December 2023. Dover District's existing Local Plan consists of the Core Strategy 2010 and the Land Allocations Plan 2015, as well as saved policies from the 2002 Local Plan. Since these plans were written, the Government has made changes to legislation, policy and guidance which means they now need to be reviewed and updated.

What is a Local Plan

- This Plan establishes the vision, strategic objectives and overarching development strategy required to meet the needs of the district to 2040.
- It sets out the strategic planning policies of the Council on the important issues facing the District including responding to climate change, accommodating
 population trends, enabling economic growth, improving provision of community facilities and infrastructure across the district and the need to protect and
 enhance our natural and historic environments.
- It establishes a broad range of clear development management policies to shape decisions on all planning applications that come forward in the District.
- · It clarifies in detail where new homes, workplaces and infrastructure facilities will be located across the District through allocations of land.
- It helps to enrich the District's biodiversity, protect its valued landscapes and conserve and enhance the wide range of historic and natural assets that the District enjoys.

How has the Plan been prepared

The preparation of the Local Plan has been informed by stakeholder and community engagement, discussions with neighbouring authorities and other relevant bodies under the Duty to Co-operate, the development of an evidence base to support the Plan and other relevant Plans and Strategies. The Plan has also been subject to a Sustainability Appraisal, Habitats Regulations Assessment and Equalities Impact Assessment, which have helped shape the overarching strategy and policies in the Plan.

Consultation on the Local Plan has been carried out in accordance with the Council's adopted Statement of Community Involvement

Regulation 18 Consultation +

The draft Regulation 18 Local Plan was published for consultation for a period of eight weeks from January to March 2021.

The purpose of the draft Local Plan was to:

- · Identify the key issues for the District and the options that have been considered to address them;
- · Set out a draft vision for Dover District in 2040 and the objectives needed to meet that vision;
- · Identify the draft strategy for meeting growth and development needs over the next 20 years, and the land required to deliver the strategy; and
- · Set out draft policies for guiding future development in the District.

Regulation 18 Comments 🔹 🗸

The draft Regulation 18 Local Plan was published for consultation on the 20th January 2021, for a period of 8 weeks, to the 17th March 2021.

As part of the consultation on the Draft Local Plan we also invited comments to be made on the Sustainability Appraisal, Habitats Regulation Assessment, Draft Economic Growth Strategy and the Draft Open Space, Playing Pitches and Play Areas Strategies. In addition to holding a targeted call for sites.

In total over 3,000 comments were received on the draft Local Plan from over 1200 individuals and organisations.

Main Changes to the Regulation 19 Submission document since the Regulation 18 Draft Local Plan -

A number of changes have been made to the Plan as a result of these comments, as well as changes to national legislation and guidance that have occurred. The majority of these are minor changes and updates, however, there have been a number of more significant changes including:

- · Overall, the Local Plan Housing Need has been reduced by more than 900 dwellings.
- A number of housing site allocations have been removed from the Plan, including 500 homes at North Aylesham, 100 homes at the former Channel Tunnel
 workers accommodation, Farthingloe and 100 homes in Westcourt Lane, Shepherdswell
- · 17 new housing sites have been added that can accommodate approximately 360 dwellings.
- Economic development needs assessment updated and two new employment site allocations added, at White Cliffs Business Park (Phase 4) and Statenborough Farm in Eastry.
- Four sites have been identified for a mixture of employment to support their regeneration: the former Snowdown Colliery in Aylesham, The Citadel Western Heights, Fort Burgoyne and Dover Waterfront.
- · Gypsy and Traveller sites at Aylesham and Ewell Minnis have been removed, and a new site for intensification in Alkham is proposed.
- Wording has been changed the policy relating to residential windfall (sites not allocated in this Plan) proposals in the Kent Downs AONB to ensure
 appropriate protection and additional criteria have been added to prevent significant loss of best and most versatile agricultural land and to ensure
 proposals do not prejudice the delivery of sites allocated in the Plan due to limited highway capacity.
- Climate change policies have been updated to reflect the changes to Building Regulations of June 2022 with regard to carbon emissions, energy efficiency
 and sustainable design and construction.
- · Biodiversity policies have been strengthened to ensure maximum protection for protected habitats, landscapes and species.
- A new tariff has been introduced to fund necessary mitigation and monitoring of the Thanet Coast and Sandwich Bay SPA, an internationally protected site for migratory birds.
- Place making and design policies have been strengthened and commitment to delivering a District Design Code added.
- Plan updated to reflect latest transport modelling work with regards to Strategic Highways and Local Road Network improvements.
- · Open Space, Sports Provision and Community facilities policies have been updated, including designation of Local Green Spaces in the district.
- · Protection of River Dour has been strengthened.
- · References to Stodmarsh nutrient issues removed as they no longer apply to this district.

Where is New Development Proposed as Part of Regulation 19? -

An important element of a Local Plan is ensuring sufficient land is allocated for development to meet the objectively assessed need for housing in the District. In addition, the Plan needs to allocate a sufficient amount and variety of land for housing to deliver a continuous supply of housing over the Plan period.

Three strategic housing allocations are proposed in the Plan, at:

- Whitfield (up to 6,350 homes);
- · South Aylesham (640 homes) and
- Elvington/Eythorne (300 homes)

New housing is also proposed at other smaller settlements across the District, based primarily on the settlement hierarchy and influenced by site availability, the need to protect the most environmentally sensitive areas of the District and deliverability matters.

To grow and diversify the local economy, four sites are proposed for employment uses - the White Cliffs Business Park, Whitfield, Discovery Park, Sandwich, Aylesham Development Area and Statenborough Farm in Eastry.

Four other sites are also identified in the Plan for a mixture of employment and other uses to support their regeneration - the former Snowdown Colliery in Aylesham, Western Heights, Fort Burgoyne and Dover Waterfront.

New plans to reinvigorate Dover Town Centre are set out in the Dover Town Centre Strategy which is one of the central objectives of this new Local Plan.

Consultation on the Dover District Regulation 19 Local Plan Submission closed on the 9th of December 2022. In total over 1900 representations where made from over 500 representors. Of the total representations received 8 were group / petition representations totalling to 1706 additional representors.

Representations are currently being processed by officers in preparation for submission to the Planning Inspector. More information regarding the Local Plan timetable can be found in the Local Development Scheme.

Councillors due to consider updated Local Plan for the Dover district

Councillors are due to consider the submission version of the district's Local Plan at a meeting on Wednesday, October 12.

The document sets out the vision and framework for future development in the district up to 2040, including where new homes, shops and businesses should be built.

The plan also includes policies to ensure infrastructure is provided to support new development, to protect and enhance the natural environment, and to mitigate and adapt to climate change.

A public consultation of the draft document took place during spring 2021, with more than 3,000 comments received.

These comments were all considered, and alongside national policy and background evidence, have informed an updated version of the Local Plan, with a number of changes made.

The key changes to site allocations are:

- · The addition of 17 new housing sites that can accommodate approximately 360 dwellings
- · Two new employment site allocations at White Cliffs Business Park (Phase 4) and Statenborough Farm in Eastry
- Four sites identified for a mixture of employment to support their regeneration: the former Snowdown Colliery in Aylesham, The Citadel Western Heights, Fort Burgoyne and Dover Waterfront

The following housing site allocations have been removed from the Plan:

- 500 homes at north Aylesham
- · 100 homes at the former Channel Tunnel workers accommodation, Farthingloe
- · 100 homes in Westcourt Lane, Shepherdswell
- Several other housing site allocations including at Lower Gore Field in Eastry, Wycherley Crescent in Dover, the former guide hut in Whitfield and land at Monkton Court Lane have also been removed.

Overall, the number of homes identified through site allocations has reduced by more than 1,000 dwellings.

Three strategic housing allocations at Whitfield (up to 6,350 homes), South Aylesham (640 homes) and Elvington/Eythorne (300 homes), are still proposed in the Plan.

Subject to approval of the Local Plan by councillors, a seven-week consultation will begin on Friday, October 21.

A Local Plan hotline will be in place and public engagement events held both online and at locations across the district.

Following the public consultation, the submission version will be sent to the Planning Inspectorate alongside the responses received and supporting documentation.

The Inspectorate will then carry out independent examination in public of the Plan.

Cllr Nicholas Kenton, cabinet member for planning and environment, said: "The Local Plan is the blueprint for development in the Dover district over the next 20 years and sits at the heart of the planning system.

"This important document provides the framework against which all planning decisions are considered.

"Not only does it provide a framework for housing development, it will also assist in securing much-needed community facilities and services for people living in the Dover district.

"As well as identifying sites for development, the Local Plan includes policies covering a range of topics such as climate change, design and place-making, the natural and historic environment, town centres, transport and infrastructure.

"These policies will ensure that development within the district is of high quality, meets the needs of local people and is supported by the necessary infrastructure."










Dover District Local Plan - Policies Map

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



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

The key changes to site allocations are:

- The addition of 17 new housing sites that can accommodate approximately 360 dwellings
- Two new employment site allocations at White Cliffs Business Park (Phase 4) and Statenborough Farm in Eastry
- Four sites identified for a mixture of employment to support their regeneration: the former Snowdown Colliery in Aylesham, The Citadel Western Heights, Fort Burgoyne and Dover Waterfront

The following housing site allocations have been removed from the Plan:

- 500 homes at north Aylesham
- 100 homes at the former Channel Tunnel workers accommodation, Farthingloe
- 100 homes in Westcourt Lane, Shepherdswell
- Several other housing site allocations including at Lower Gore Field in Eastry, Wycherley Crescent in Dover, the former guide hut in Whitfield and land at Monkton Court Lane have also been removed.

Overall, the number of homes identified through site allocations has reduced by more than 1,000 dwellings.

Three strategic housing allocations at Whitfield (up to 6,350 homes), South Aylesham (640 homes) and Elvington/Eythorne (300 homes), are still proposed in the Plan.

Subject to approval of the Local Plan by councillors, a seven-week consultation will begin on Friday, October 21.

A Local Plan hotline will be in place and public engagement events held both online and at locations across the district.

Following the public consultation, the submission version will be sent to the Planning Inspectorate alongside the responses received and supporting documentation.

The Inspectorate will then carry out independent examination in public of the Plan.

Cllr Nicholas Kenton, cabinet member for planning and environment, said: "The Local Plan is the blueprint for development in the Dover district over the next 20 years and sits at the heart of the planning system.

"This important document provides the framework against which all planning decisions are considered.

"Not only does it provide a framework for housing development, it will also assist in securing much-needed community facilities and services for people living in the Dover district.

"As well as identifying sites for development, the Local Plan includes policies covering a range of topics such as climate change, design and place-making, the natural and historic environment, town centres, transport and infrastructure.

"These policies will ensure that development within the district is of high quality, meets the needs of local people and is supported by the necessary infrastructure."

Whilst Aylesham Parish Council agrees there is a need to build homes both nationally and within the Dover District, Aylesham has certainly seen its fair share of development recently.

New houses, without adequate local infrastructure, put significant strain on local amenities like medical services, shops, nursery places, as well increasing traffic on our roads.

We welcome the fact that 500 homes in 'North Aylesham' have been removed from the Draft Dover District Local Plan, but this still leaves a huge development of 640 houses linking Aylesham and Snowdown into one large settlement. When it is finished, the current development will contain over 1,200 houses and so an additional 640, in what is considered a rural setting, seems rather excessive.

It is also welcomed to see the former Snowdown Colliery site featuring in the Draft Dover District Local Plan for mixed use development: this will allow future generations to appreciate the local heritage whilst creating jobs for local people.

All of this must not come at a cost to locals: any development must improve Aylesham, and not let it get left behind.

Aylesham Parish Council urges all residents to use this opportunity to help shape the village over the next two decades and share your views with Dover District Council.







Save Our Community Land

In 2010 Sandwich farmer John Bean kindly offered to gift part of his land, on Deal Road near Sandwich Technology School, to the Sandwich Sports and Leisure Centre Trust for community sports use. Dover District Council Planners subsequently designated this for sports use in the Local Plan 2010; the other part of the land was designated for 60 houses.

Following the Technology School's appropriation of the Leisure Centre in 2020, the trust became 'Club Sandwich' and has been working on designs, supported by commercial sponsors, to provide a new public community center on the land, with a lap pool, teaching pool, studios, spa and sports pitch. A £1,200 Pre-Application proposal was submitted to the DDC, which was approved in 2020.

DDC are currently producing their 2020-22 Local Plan, which is out for public consultation now. In January 2022 they wrote to the Trust to confirm their ongoing commitment to community sports use for this land. However, despite continuing correspondence, when the Local Plan was published in September 2022 the designation had inexplicably been removed and a valuable community space lost for the future. We are objecting and have raised a petition to send to DDC.

This is agricultural land, needed to feed our own population in a sustainable fashion and development would cause traffic chaos on the road to Ringwould and throughout the village.

- To respond to the challenges of the climate emergency, ensuring that all new development is designed to adapt to, and mitigate against, the effects of climate change, including by reducing carbon emissions, increasing energy efficiency, and through the integration of design and construction features that enable resilience to the harmful effects of climate change.
- To manage flood risk sustainably in a way that ensures the safety of residents and property and take opportunities to reduce flood risk where possible.
- To conserve or enhance the designated and undesignated heritage assets of the District in a manner appropriate to their significance, recognising their intrinsic value as a finite resource as well as their contribution to the character of the District and the positive role they can play in the regeneration of the District.
- To conserve and enhance the District's biodiversity and green infrastructure, including international, national and locally

protected landscapes and coastlines, all designated wildlife sites, priority habitats and species and to enhance ecological connectivity between them, delivering a net gain in biodiversity. 

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Climate Change

Dover District Council declared a climate change emergency on the 4th November 2019, including an ambition to become a net zero carbon emitter by 2030 at the latest.

The Local Plan will support and help to deliver the Council's approach to the climate change emergency through policies which aim to ensure that development proposals which come forward between now and 2040 mitigate against and adapt to the effects of climate change.

In particular, policies in the Plan support and require:

- Reducing carbon emissions in all new residential development to meet the Future Home Standard should this Standard come forward through the planning system (Policy CC1)
- Requiring all commercial development to achieve the BREEAM Very Good standard overall, including Very Good for addressing maximum energy efficiencies under energy credits, until such time as the Future
- Installation of the highest water efficiency standards allowed in new development (Policy CC4)
- Preventing an increase in the risk of flooding by requiring development to be in accordance with the Council's Strategic Flood Risk Assessment (Policy CC5) and by the use of sustainable drainage systems to accommodate surface water in new developments (Policy CC6)
- Building Standards come into force (Policy CC1)
- The use of Sustainable Design and Construction methods (Policy CC2) and support for installations for renewable energy developments (Policy CC3)
- Provision of non-car-based modes of transport in new developments (Policies SP1 and TI1)
- Protection of Coastal Change Management Areas by preventing inappropriate development (Policy CC7)
- An increase in tree planting and protection, including by requiring a minimum of 2 new trees to be planted for every new dwelling and a minimum of one new tree for every 500sqm of new commercial floorspace (Policy CC8)

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New Homes

How many new homes must we plan for?

National policy means that the Local Plan must seek to meet the District's identified housing need, based on a government specified methodology.

This means that our new Plan needs to identify land to deliver a minimum of 10,998 new homes across the plan period to 2040 (611 a year).

Where is the new housing proposed?

The distribution of housing growth is mainly based on the existing settlement hierarchy and is influenced by environmental and other constraints.

• New sites for housing development will continue to be focused on the development and regeneration of the town of Dover and the urban expansion at Whitfield. A minimum of 3,381 new homes are therefore proposed in and around Dover Town, the majority of which will be delivered by the urban extension at Whitfield.

- Land is allocated to deliver in the region of 220 homes in Deal, 650 homes in Aylesham and 230 homes in Sandwich.
- Development in rural areas will be spread across the district's local centres and large and small villages taking into account constraints and the social and community facilities and services available. Land is allocated for approximately 1,112 homes at rural villages. This includes approximately 350 new homes at Eythorne and Elvington to strengthen this local centre in the District.

Residential windfall development (sites, usually small in scale, which come forward for development, but which have not been allocated in the Plan) is also expected to contribute to the supply of housing over the plan period. Policy SP4 sets out the criteria against which such applications will be assessed.

What kind of houses are needed?

The Plan sets out a requirement that 30% of housing in new developments must be 'affordable' housing (Policy SP5), with the exception of the existing Dover Urban Area where viability work has concluded that it is not economically viable to provide affordable housing.

A need for 14 additional Gypsy and Traveller pitches in the District over the Plan period has been identified. This will be met in part by the intensification of some existing identified sites (Policy H3).



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Place-making and Design

High-quality, inclusive design is essential in creating and maintaining places and communities across this District where people want to live and work, now and in the future. Delivering development that achieves design excellence and that adds to the existing high quality, natural and historic environment is therefore a key priority for the Council.

The existing Dover development plan does not contain any design policies and planning officers rely instead on national government advice. This new Local Plan seeks to address this and to ensure that local design objectives are also taken into account in all planning applications. Three design policies are proposed:

Planning for Healthy and Inclusive Communities (Strategic Policy SP2)

This Policy promotes improvements in the health and wellbeing of residents through high quality place making, including the provision of attractive areas of green open spaces.

Achieving High Quality Design and Place Making (Policy PM1)

This Policy sets out detailed design requirements to ensure that new buildings and spaces are of the highest design quality and to create attractive inclusive healthy places which promote local distinctiveness and a sense of place. It also advises that where significant design implications are identified on major proposals these will be referred to a Design Review Panel.


Quality of Residential Accommodation (Policy PM2)

This Policy confirms the criteria that new housing developments must meet to ensure the delivery of high-quality residential accommodation across the District, including meeting the nationally described space standards, and accessible and wheelchair friendly home requirements.

The Plan also includes policies to ensure new open spaces, facilities and infrastructure facilities are provided with developments. These are: Providing Open Space (Policy PM3), Sports Provision (Policy PM4), Community Facilities and Services (Policy PM6).

To support these Policies a Design Code for the District, along with locally specific Design Codes for areas where significant development is proposed, will be produced.



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The Local Economy

The Local Plan can do much to support the health of the economy and in particular provide for new premises and sites that businesses need.

As with housing growth, the new Plan provides a firm foundation for meeting our future employment needs for the period up to 2040. Alongside policies for assessing planning applications for commercial proposals, land allocations for business and employment purposes are made at:

- White Cliffs Business Park (Policy SP6 and SAP2)
- Discovery Park, Sandwich (Policy SP6)
- Aylesham Development area (Policy SP6 and SAP25)
- Statenborough Farm, Eastry (Policy SP6 and SAP31)

Four sites are allocated for regeneration through a mix of uses at:

- The former Snowdown Colliery, Aylesham (Policy SP6 and SAP26)
- Western Heights, Dover (Policy SP6 and SAP4)
- Fort Burgoyne, Dover (Policy SP6 and SAP5)
- Dover Waterfront (Policy SP6 and SAP3)

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
Town Centres

The new Local Plan is also an opportunity to encourage retail and leisure growth.

The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic has been particularly keenly felt in town centres and by the retail and hospitality sectors, which form the heart of many of the settlements of this District. The Local Plan includes policies to protect the vitality and viability of Deal and Sandwich town centres (Policies SP9 and SP10)

For Dover Town Centre, the Local Plan includes a new Town Centre Strategy (Policy SP8) to create a more vibrant town centre, encourage a diverse range of uses, increase the number of visitors and improve the environment and connectivity between the town centre and the sea front area.

- Policy R1 identifies the primary shopping areas for Dover, Deal and Sandwich Town Centres, setting out what uses and development will be allowed in them.
- Policy R2 ensures new town centre development proposed outside of the towns does not harm their vitality and viability, by requiring sequential tests and impact assessments to be carried out.
- Policy R3 supports the provision of new local shops and protects existing ones to support local communities.
- Policy R4 ensures the design of new shopfronts is high quality and appropriate for the area.



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Ensuring that the right infrastructure is provided in the right place, at the right time, to support the scale of growth identified in the Plan will be integral to its successful delivery.

The Local Plan is therefore supported by an Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) which identifies specific infrastructure needs for the District over the plan period, covering all types of services such as education, health, community, sports and open spaces, transport, water and other utilities. We welcome your views on the draft IDP during this consultation. It is a 'living' document which will evolve over time.


For the site allocations in the plan, infrastructure requirements are set out in the site policies. In addition, the Local Plan includes policies addressing strategic transport issues such as the A2 and other local infrastructure requirements which should be provided with new development:

- Infrastructure and Developer Contributions (Strategic Policy SP11)
- Strategic Transport Infrastructure (Strategic Policy SP12)
- Providing Open Space (Policy PM3)
- Sports Provision (Policy PM4)
- Protection of Open Space, Sports Facilities and Local Green Space (Policy PM5)
- Community Facilities and Services (Policy PM6)
- Digital Technology (Policy TI5)

These policies enable the Council to require new or enhanced infrastructure through a process known as 'Planning' Obligations' or 'Section 106 Agreements'. These can require developers to create new facilities within their site, or provide financial contributions to existing services to enhance them. More information on this process can be found in the S106 and IDP FAQs document.

With regards to ensuring local highway needs are addressed, including for active travel such as walking, cycling and bus and enough parking is provided in new developments, the Local Plan includes the following policies:

- Sustainable Transport and Travel (Policy TI1)
- Transport Statements, Assessments and Travel Plans (Policy TI2)
- Parking provision on new development (Policy TI3)

Natural Environment

Dover District enjoys spectacular landscapes and coastlines, many of which are valued and protected at local, regional, national and international level. These landscape assets are rich in biodiversity, priority habitats and protected species and, importantly, provide significant environmental, social, and economic benefits for the district and its residents.

A key issue for the Local Plan is therefore how best to embrace growth in a way which respects and enhances our important landscapes, habitats and countryside, while also recognising that some forms of development support the rural economy and are necessary to maintain the vibrancy of rural communities, as guided by the housing and the local economy policies of the plan.

Policies are included to conserve and enhance the rich natural environment of the District.

- Strategic Policy SP13 will protect the District's Hierarchy of Designated Environmental Sites and Biodiversity Assets.
- Strategic Policy SP14 will enhance our Green Infrastructure and Biodiversity.
- Policy NE1 will deliver a net gain in biodiversity in the District over the plan period.
- Policy NE2 requires development to protect and enhance the landscape character and distinctiveness of the District's countryside and coastline, including irreplaceable habitats, the areas of the Kent Downs AONB that fall within the boundary of the District and regionally important geological sites.
- Policy NE3 ensures against harmful impacts on the protected migratory bird species and integrity of the Thanet
 Coast and Sandwich Bay SPA through a Mitigation and Monitoring Strategy.
- Policy NE4 seeks to deliver improvements in air quality over the Plan period.
- Policy NE5 protects and seeks to enhance the water supply and water quality of the District.
- Policy NE6 protects and seeks to enhance the rare ecosystem of the River Dour chalk stream.

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Historic Environment

Dover District benefits from a particularly significant archaeological and historical heritage, in part due to its strategic location as a gateway to Britain. This wealth of heritage assets includes those of national and international importance.

The district is home to almost 2,000 listed buildings, 48 Scheduled Ancient Monuments, 57 Conservation Areas, 21 historic parks and gardens, one protected wreck site and 12 museums.

The current development plan for the District includes only one historic environment policy (for applications affecting Historic Parks and Gardens), and a strategic site policy for Dover Western Heights. The government however requires local planning authorities to set out a positive strategy for the conservation and enjoyment of the historic environment, including heritage assets most at risk through neglect, decay or other threats.

This Local Plan therefore sets out a clear and positive strategy for the conservation, enjoyment and enhancement of our historic environment in the form of the following policies:

Protecting the District's Historic Environment (Strategic Policy SP15)

- Designated and non-designated Heritage Assets (Policy HE1)
- Conservation Areas (Policy HE2)
- Archaeology (Policy HE3)
- Historic Parks and Gardens (Policy HE4)
- Dover Western Heights Fortifications Scheduled Monument and Conservation Area (Site Allocation Policy SAP4)

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

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


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
